

The Honorable Marc Lovecchio is a Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. Marc Lovecchio has resided in Williamsport since 1987 when he relocated from Pittsburgh with his wife, Angela Campana a city native. They have three children: Francis 27, Peter 25 and Louise 19. Angela practiced law for many years both in Pittsburgh and in Lycoming County before changing careers to become a high school English teacher at Williamsport High School. Judge Lovecchio graduated from Princeton University in 1980 and from the University of Pittsburgh School of Law, cum laude, in 1984. He worked as a lawyer in a large Pittsburgh firm before becoming a partner at the Williamsport firm of Campana and Lovecchio. The firm eventually became Campana, Lovecchio and Morrone, P.C. where Judge Lovecchio practiced for many years in numerous areas of law both in federal and state Courts.

Judge Lovecchio was elected to the Bench in 2009 and began serving in January of 2010. He presently handles primarily criminal cases. He also supervises the Underage Drinking Court. Judge Lovecchio is active in the Conference of State Trial Judges. He is a member of the Education Committee and Criminal Law Committee. The Judge presented numerous sessions to the state judges over the past 5 years, primarily on Substance Abuse, criminal law issues and Mental Health. Judge Lovecchio started and presently supervises the Lycoming County Medical Assisted Treatment (Vivitrol Court) program. He has also recently started the 24/7 pilot program to combat DUI recidivism.

In addition to his judicial duties he remains very active in the local soccer community serving as president of Balls Mills Soccer Club and coaching high school and youth teams. He and his family are members of St. Joseph the Worker Parish in Williamsport. Judge Lovecchio frequently lectures in the community and at local colleges and high schools on various criminal topics such as the death penalty, victim rights, substance abuse and juvenile delinquency.
