





Dear Municipal and/or Authority Leader:

Some of you have inquired about the Marcellus Shale Gas Fee funds distributed last December to Lycoming County by the Commonwealth under the provisions of the Oil and Gas Act of 2012 (commonly known as Act 13). As you may recall from the April 2012 briefing—Act 13 Implementation Presentation to the Community, the County stated it would update you once a defined application process is established. In a letter dated November 19, 2012, the County reterated a similar message.

Like many of you, the County had gas impact-related expenses that had to be addressed before any decisions could be made on a competitive grant program. Now, the County is happy to announce that it is ready to launch its first competitive application round.

Act 13 of 2012 has legislatively established the categories that are eligible for the County to invest in. Beyond this, a number of competitive criteria has been identified that will allow the County to evaluate all requests more objectively and ensure funding decisions are merit-based and targeted to reach those projects or programs that yield the greatest benefit to the community. You should also know that this process will operate on a reimbursement basis and that funds will be awarded under the terms of a bi-party legal agreement.




