
- Pennsylvania Act 101 of 1988


- Regional Stakeholder Committee







County Recycling Programs

Columbia

- Provides advice and technical assistance to their municipalities, along with education programs
- 4 communities with recycling drop-off sites and also 6 composting sites

Lycoming

 Lycoming County Resource Management Services offers a wide variety of services to its county residents and residents in surrounding counties

Montour

- Provides assistance to its 11 municipalities concerning recycling, composting, solid waste management and in holding recycling events.
- Danville Borough drop-off and curbside recycling program

Snyder

 Serval county municipalities provide resident with drop-offrecycling locations, education and periodic special events

Union

- Provides a series of drop-off locations throughout the county, with two locations containing curbside collection
- Lewisburg Borough operates yard waste drop-off and leaf collection

Plan Recommendations for County Programs

Serval Recommendations targeted at specific County Programs were made in the plan. Highlighted recommendations mention:

- Need for Additional Funding for recycling coordinator and special collections
- Assistance for municipalities to address disposal of non-recyclable materials
- Plan coordination need to operate recycling drop-off sites
- Need for Battery Disposal Program
