# LYCOMING COUNTY PRISON BOARD MEETING MINUTES | PUBLIC MEETING Friday, July 11, 2025

# 1.0 Regularly Scheduled Prison Board Meeting Called to Order by Commissioner Scott

<u>Metzger.</u> Meeting conducted from the Lycoming County Commissioners Meeting Room, with optional teleconference.

- 1.1 Meeting convened at 8:35 A.M.
- 1.2 Approval of Minutes: Commissioner Mark Mussina motioned for approval of July 2025 meeting Minutes. Nicki Gottschall seconded the motion; the motion carried.
- 1.3 Public Comment (Agenda Items Only) None

# 2.0 Expenditure Report:

2.1 Approval of Expenditure Report: Nancy Butts motioned for the approval of June 2025 Expenditure Report. Nicole Gottschall seconded the motion; the motion was carried.

- **3.0** Approval of Personnel Actions: Marc Mussina motioned for the approval of personnel actions as follows.
  - 3.1 Nancy Butts seconded the motion; the motion carried

    - Tara Stackhouse, Full-Time Correctional Officer-Relief
- 4.0 <u>Informational Reports/Highlights:</u> Warden Shoemaker reviewed the June Prison Reports as follows:
  - **4.1** Population:
    - Males in blocks averaged 176.73; males in PRC averaged 39.77; the total average daily population of males equaled 216.50, with a peak of 226.00.
    - Females in blocks averaged 24.47; females in PRC averaged 11.33, the total average daily population of females equaled 35.80, with a peak of 42.00.
    - The combined average daily population of male/female population equaled 252.30, with a peak of 264.00.
    - In-Home detention averaged 0.23 males and 0.50 females.
    - With no overcrowding transfer population, the total average daily population was equal to the monthly average daily population of 252.30.
  - **4.2** Prison Disciplinary Hearings conducted and chaired by Deputy Warden of Inmate Services Barnes:
    - Of 52 hearings conducted for 32 inmates, 12 inmates had more than one incident. 50 hearings resulted in guilty lock-ups; 2 hearings resulted in guilty lock-up with time suspended; 0 inmate was found not guilty; and, staff generated 20 informational reports.

## 4.3 Informational Highlights:

- On June 5, 2025, members of the SCI Muncy Critical Incident Stress
   Management (CISM) Team toured the Prison and PRC.
- On June 5 and 26, 2025, Prison staff attended Expandable Baton Training conducted by Correctional Officer Trevor Bowes.
- On June 16, 2025, Deputy Warden Ebner and Warden Shoemaker attended the Lycoming County CJAB Pre-Trial Subcommittee meeting.

### 4.4 Pre-Release Reports:

- Work Release males equaled 10 and females equaled 1.
- Work crew males equaled 30 and work crew females equaled 11.
- The monthly average for males at the Pre-Release Center equaled 30 and females equaled 12. The year-to-date average equaled 32 males and 8 females.
- Program Highlights:
   All staff attended Training on Report Writing, Restraints, Returns and Transfers to LCP and Hospital duty on 6/23/25 led by RS II's Doug Ellsworth and Lane Gibson.

## 4.5 Mental Health Snapshot taken on July 8, 2025:

- Of 287 total inmates in the prison system, 252 males and 35 females were categorized as follows.
- 110 males and 8 females made up Roster A, those who had no mental health history, which equated to 41.11% of the population.
- 61 males and 12 females made up Roster B, those who had past mental health history but no active symptoms in the last year, which equated to 25.44% of the population.
- 74 males and 12 females made up Roster C, those who had current mental health issues, which equated to 29.974% of the population.
- 7 males and 3 females made up Roster D, those who were determined to have serious mental illness, which equated to 3.48% of the population.
- Psychotropic Medication at PRC: Of 27 male Work Crew inmates, 6 were on psychotropic medications. Of 11 male Work Release inmates, 3 were on psychotropic medications. Total medicated males at PRC equaled 23.68%.
- Of 10 female Work Crew inmates, 5 were on psychotropic medications. Of 1 female Work Release, 0 was on psychotropic medications. Total medicated females at PRC equaled 50.00%.

- Psychotropic Medication at LCP: Of 187 males overall, 82 (43.85%) were on psychotropic medications. Of 21 females overall, 8 (38.10) were on psychotropic medications.
- <u>Total Medicated Inmates within the Prison System:</u> Overall, PRC averaged 28.57% medicated inmates. LCP averaged 43.27% medicated inmates. The total average percentage equaled 40.47% medicated inmates in the prison system.
- 4.6 Tyler Flood, the Re-Entry Coordinator, discussed the APO Reentry Program report prepared by Deputy Chief John Stahl. The total program population of 106 participants, as of July 1, 2025, are categorized as follows.
  - Male clients equaled 77 and female clients equaled 29.
  - Phase two clients equaled 59, phase three clients equaled 21.
  - Total Successfully discharged clients: 772.
  - Total processed intakes, including those who returned to the program, equaled
     2,217 participants. Overall individual intakes without return to program is 1,446.
  - GPS/Alcohol monitoring serviced a total population of 34 clients categorized as follows: 10 clients with Alcohol Monitoring (TAD); 6 clients with GPS monitoring; 16 clients with Home Guard, and 2 clients with SL3 Breathalyzers.
  - Total clients electronically serviced to date equaled 2,226.
  - 131,888 total days have been served on electronic monitoring services.
  - Monthly total intake breakdown reports 13 clients for the month of July.
- 4.7 Tyler Flood discussed the In-Prison Reentry Program, which had 46 current active participants and 1 pending intake as of July 11, 2025. Since January 2025, the following statistics are recorded as follows:
  - 63 intakes have been completed, 8 ORAS Assessment has been completed, 7
     Transitional Action Plans (TAP) for participants were created for participants, and
     31 sessions were completed.

- 52 total participants were released from incarceration and programming. Of those participants, 17 referrals/appointments were made and 254 other resources were given. Other resources comprise educational pamphlets or similar developmental information.
- 78 total referrals were made to the program, of which 71 were referred by LCP and 3 were from PRC. Of all referrals, 14 refused to participate, 2 were released from incarceration before being seen by the coordinator, and 0 did not meet criteria.
- 10 total referrals were made to the program in June.
- Total referrals categorized by the type of sentence are as follows: 6 from probation violations; 6 from max out cases; 45 from new cases; 16 from domestic matters; 5 from contempt matters; and 0 from treatment court and pretrial matters.
- Statistics for Re-Entry Services reported 108 average participants per day; 19 total intakes; 15 total discharges; 6 successful completions; and Electronic Monitoring averaged 117 total participants as follows: 35 adult, 62 Pre-Trial and 20 juvenile participants.
