Species	Size	Description
Eastern White Pine	10-20"	Evergreen: Has soft, long needles. Grows rapidly in a variety of soil and prefers sun. Extremely hardy. Grows to 6 feet in 8-11 years. Max 100ft.
Colorado Blue Spruce	6-12"	Evergreen: Has blue-green color. Can grow 50-75 feet. Good windbreak. Popular Christmas tree. Grow to six feet in 10-12 years. Max 100ft
Norway Spruce	12-24"	Evergreen: Highly valued ornamental and timber tree. One of the best conifers for shelters and windbreaks. Fast growing Max.75-80
White Spruce	10-20"	Evergreen: Grows to 50 feet. Stiff needles are light bluish-green, usually less than 1 inch in length. This spruce thrives in well drained or moist soil. Extremely hardy.
Red Oak	15-30"	Fast growth 60 to 70 feet with equal spread. Grows best in sandy to rich loamy soil in full sun. The fastest growing of all oaks. Tolerant of urban conditions such as salt.
Swamp White Oak	12-24"	Grows to 50 to 60 feet in height and spread. Does well in wet, swampy conditions along rivers and streams. Excellent choice for wetland plantings.
Chestnut Oak	18-36"	Height and spread to 60 feet. Can tolerate poor, dry, rocky soil. Acorns are rich dark brown with a very sweet taste. Relished by squirrels, deer and other wildlife.
Old Fashion Lilac	8-16"	Dense, vigorous growth to 15 feet. Spread 6 to 10 feet. Light lavender flowers in late spring.
Red Maple	12-24"	Also known as Scarlet or Swamp Maple. Growth 40 to 60 feet. Highly prized because of its bright red flowers in early spring before leaves appear.
American Persimmon	18-36"	Fruit is mostly used in jams and jellies. Showy fall color and provide wildlife food.
Silky Dogwood	15-20"	Grows to 9 feet. Grows best in well drained, moist soil. Berries attract birds. Very good for soil erosion on banks.
Winterberry Holly	10-20"	Attractive shrub. Provides red berries through the winter. Good wetland plant. Likes acidic soil. Should plant several for good pollination.
American Hazelnut	15-30"	Easy to grow native shrub that produces edible nuts in late summer, excellent hedgerow plant, and is highly attractive to wildlife.
Black Walnut	8-16"	Grows to 100 feet with a broad, open crown of almost equal spread. Grows best in deep, rich, moist soils. Produces large, rich, flavorful nuts. A highly valued hardwood.
Streamco Willow	12-24"	Should reach 12-15' Narrow, Lustrous dark green leaves with olive- gray stems. Extremely fast growth. Prefers cleared, moist soil along streambanks. Disease and insect resistant.
Northern Hackberry	6-12"	Also known as Nettle Tree or Sugarberry. Dark green leaves, spring through fall. Dark purplish-red fruits, fall. Widely used as a street tree due to its fast, straight growth.
Am. Cranberrybush Viburnum	12-24"	A deciduous shrub, growing 8 to 12 feet with a spread to 8 to 12 feet. White flowers, in clusters in May. Bright red berries early September through fall into February.
Eastern Redbud	12-24"	Height 20 to 30 feet. Spread 25 to 35 feet. Flowers are perfect reddish-purple in bud, opening to a rosy-pink with purplish tinge in early spring. Large, heart-shaped leaves.
American Chestnut Hybrid	8-16"	A fast-growing hybrid reaching a height of 80 to 100 feet. You should plant a minimum of two trees. These trees are not guaranteed to be blight resistant
BLUEBERRY Bluecrop	12"	Produces all-purpose blueberries that are firm and somewhat tart — great for preserves, baking, freezing, and fresh eating. Produces a large crop to harvest in July.
BLUEBERRY Earliblue	12"	A medium-sized shrub that is typically grown for its edible qualities. It produces large clusters of blue round berries in early summer. The berries have a sweet taste.
APPLE* Redcort	4-6 Ft. Semi-Dwarf	A "sport" variety of Cortland, with heavy red streaking over yellow-green skin. It is a large, apple with white flesh. Its flavor is more tart than sweet, and it is an all-purpose apple.
APPLE* Honeycrisp	4-6 Ft. Semi-Dwarf	A medium-to-large sized apple, with a light green/yellow background largely covered with red-orange flush. The skin may be flecked with occasional russet dots.
RASPBERRIES Black Jewel	Trsp	Large, firm berries of superior quality. Vigorous, consistently productive, and resistant to anthracnose and widely adapted. Excellent flavor.
RASPBERRIES Red Everbearing	Trsp	Very high quality. Plants are very vigorous and erect. Fruit has excellent flavor and can be both canned or frozen. Plants produce crops in the summer with extra crops in the fall.

**Apples require another variety for pollination.*
