



ONIONS,FRESH,CHOPPED	2-1/4 lbs	1 qts 2-3/8 cup	2-1/2 lbs
WATER	6-1/4 lbs	3 qts	
JUICE,ORANGE	8-3/4 lbs	1 gal	
HOT SAUCE	3 oz	1/4 cup 2-1/3 tbsp

Method

- Wash chicken thoroughly under cold running water. Drain well.
- 2 Lightly spray steam jacketed kettle with non-stick cooking spray. Stir-cook onions in a steam jacketed kettle or stock pot 3 minutes stirring constantly.
- 3 Combine onions, water, orange juice, hot pepper sauce, salt, garlic powder, marjoram, rosemary, cilantro and thyme.
- 4 Pour 2-1/4 qt marinade over chicken in each roasting pan; cover. CCP: Marinate under refrigeration at 41 F. or lower for 45 minutes.
- 5 Remove chicken from marinade. Reserve marinade for use in Step 8. CCP: Refrigerate marinade at 41 F. or lower.
- 6 Place 25 chicken breasts on each lightly sprayed sheet pan. Lightly spray chicken with cooking spray.
- 7 Using a convection oven, bake 12 to 14 minutes on high fan, closed vent. CCP: Internal temperature must reach 165 F. or higher for 15 seconds.
- 8 Transfer chicken to steam table pans. Hold at 140 F. or higher for use in Step 9.
- 9 Bring reserved marinade and honey to a boil. Blend cornstarch and cold water together, stir to make a smooth slurry. Add slurry to hot sauce, stirring constantly. Cover; reduce heat; simmer 3 to 5 minutes or until thickened, stirring frequently to prevent sticking. CCP: Temperature must reach 165 F. or higher for 15 seconds.
- 10 Pour 1-1/4 quart sauce evenly over chicken in each pan. CCP: Hold for service at 140 F. or higher.

2 pitted dates

½ cup canned pumpkin puree (not canned pumpkin pie)

6 oz. nonfat plain Greek yogurt

1/2 tsp - Vanilla extract

20 grams (2tbsp), vanilla protein powder







Appendix B: Certificate of Eligibility (COE)

The first step in obtaining a VA direct or VA-backed home loan is to apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (COE). This document confirms to lenders that the borrower is eligible for the VA home loan benefit.

How to apply for a COE

Apply through your lender: Most lenders have access to the WebLGY system. This internet-based application can establish eligibility and issue an online COE in a matter of seconds. Not all cases can be processed through WebLGY, because the system can only establish eligibility in cases which VA has sufficient data in our records. However, VA encourages you to ask your lender if they can receive the COE through VA's WebLGY system.

Apply online: Go to www.VA.gov. You can log in using your current Digital Service (DS) Logon or by creating a new account using ID.me.

Apply by mail: Obtaining a COE by mail may take longer than requesting via Internet or VA system. Fill out <u>VA Form 26-1880</u> (Request for Certificate of Eligibility) and mail to the address of your state listed on the back of the form.

Overview

Created by the original G.I. Bill (<u>Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944</u>), the VA-Guaranteed Home Loan program has helped generations of Veterans, Servicemembers, and their families enjoy the dream of homeownership and the opportunity to retain their homes in times of temporary financial hardship.

What is the VA Home Loan 'Guaranty'?

The VA home loan guaranty is an agreement that VA will reimburse a lender (such as banks, credit unions, mortgage companies, etc.) in the event of loss due to foreclosure. This guaranty takes the place of your down payment.

Who is eligible for a VA Home Loan?

Active-duty servicemembers and Veterans with discharges other than dishonorable, National Guard and Reserve service members and Veterans with an honorable discharge, certain eligible spouses, and other uniformed service personnel may be eligible for VA home loan guaranty benefits. The full listing is available online at: https://www.va.gov/housing-assistance/home-loans/eligibility/.

Is there a fee to use the VA Home Loan Guaranty?

Yes, but the funding fee can be waived (see list below). To keep the program viable, Congress instituted a program funding fee, which is a percentage of the total loan amount. This user fee varies based whether the loan is a first-time or subsequent (second, third, etc.) use of the benefit. The funding fee may be paid in cash or included in the loan at closing.

*The funding fee can also be paid by the seller, lender, or any other party on your behalf. (See Chapter 8 of the Lenders Handbook)

The following individuals do not pay the VA funding fee:

- Veterans receiving VA compensation for a service-connected disability.
- Veterans entitled to receive VA compensation for a service-connected disability, but receive retirement pay or active service pay.
- Unremarried surviving spouses of Veterans who died in active service or from a serviceconnected disability.
- Service member with a proposed or memorandum rating from VA, prior to loan closing, as eligible to receive compensation as a result of a pre-discharge claim.
- Service member on active duty who provides, on or before the date of loan closing, evidence of having been awarded the Purple Heart.

Is there a limit to the size of a VA-backed mortgage?

There are no loan limits if one has full home loan benefit or full entitlement. If you are a first-time homebuyer or have sold your previous VA-backed home and paid your loan in full, you can enjoy VA-backing on a home loan regardless of home price and without the need for a down payment. Of course, you must be able to afford the home and the property must appraise for at least the purchase price, otherwise you may have to make a small down payment.

How to Avoid a Scam



- Protect your personal or financial information in response to a request that you didn't expect, even if the caller has some of your personal information. Legitimate organizations won't email or text to ask for your sensitive personal information, like your Social Security number, bank account or credit card number.
- Know how a scammer tells you how to pay. Never pay someone who insists you pay with cryptocurrency; mobile
 payment app like Venmo, Zelle; or wire transfer service like Western Union or MoneyGram; or a gift card. And never
 deposit a check and send money back to someone.
- Block unwanted calls and text messages and report them as a scammer. Take steps to block unwanted calls and
 to filter unwanted text messages. Use call blocking or call labeling technology that is available on your cell phone
 or traditional landline. Many text and e-mail applications will allow you to report the number/e-mail.
- Resist the pressure to act immediately. Legitimate businesses will give you time to make a decision. Anyone who
 pressures you to pay or give them your personal information is a scammer. Hang up and use a publicly available
 phone number to reach out to that organization directly.
- Stop and talk to someone you trust. Before you do anything else, tell someone a friend, a family member, a
 neighbor what happened. Talking about it could help you realize it's a scam. If you think the message you have
 received is a scam, do not reply to the message unless and until you are confident that you have verification that
 the message is legitimate. If the message refers to a specific organization, use a publicly available phone number
 to reach out to that organization.

The Federal Trade Commission estimated that in 2022 alone, Veterans reported \$292M losses to fraud, this number only represents the fraud that has been detected. Romance & similar Internet schemes are up 71% from 2017. Keeping yourself safe from scams is critical when applying for

benefits and services, when accessing them, or authorizing others to do so.



Companies who advertise VA benefits can only be obtained with their help. These companies may not be recognized by VA and may be attempting to charge illegal fees.



Validate: If you are interested in working with a Veteran Service Organization (VSO), agent, or attorney, use the Office of General Counsel Accreditation tool to confirm and validate their credentials. www.va.gov/ogc/apps/accreditation/index.asp is an official source to use to verify.



Do not sign forms that are to provide "behind-the-scenes" claims assistance

Four Signs That It's a Scam

1. Scammers PRETEND to be from an organization you know.

Scammers often pretend to be contacting you on behalf of the government. They might use a real name, like the FTC, Social Security Administration, IRS, or Medicare, or make up a name that sounds official. Some pretend to be from a business you know, like a utility company, a tech company, or even a charity asking for donations.

They use technology to change the phone number that appears on your caller ID. So the name and number you see might not be real.

2. Scammers say there's a PROBLEM or a PRIZE.

They might say you're in trouble with the government. Or you owe money. Or someone in your family had an emergency. Or that there's a virus on your computer.

Some scammers say there's a problem with one of your accounts and that you need to verify some information.

Others will lie and say you won money in a lottery or sweepstakes but have to pay a fee to get it.

3. Scammers PRESSURE you to act immediately.

Scammers want you to act before you have time to think. If you're on the phone, they might tell you not to hang up so you can't check out their story.

They might threaten to arrest you, sue you, take away your driver's or business license, or deport you. They might say your computer is about to be corrupted.

4. Scammers tell you to PAY in a specific way.

They often insist that you can only pay by using cryptocurrency, wiring money through a company like MoneyGram or Western Union, using a payment app, or putting money on a gift card and then giving them the numbers on the back of the card.

Some will send you a check (that will later turn out to be fake), then tell you to deposit it and send them money.

TIPS TO AVOID VETERAN TARGETED SCAMS

Scammers are taking advantage of new opportunities to commit fraud. There's been an increase in phishing (Email), vishing (phone), and social media scams targeting Veterans, their family members, caregivers, and survivors to access their finances and benefits, or to submit claims on their behalf.

Beware of anyone who guarantees a lucrative financial benefit or service.



DO'S

- Submit applications securely online on va.gov or other federal websites or in-person through Federal agencies offering a service. Those agencies will assist in gathering evidence necessary to support it. There are no costs or hidden fees to apply.
- Be cautious of:
 - Aggressive companies who may try to pressure you to sign their contract through frequent communications or by insisting "you must act now or lose your chance for benefits."
 - Companies who claim to be contacting you on behalf of VA or to have a special relationship with VA. Contact VA at 1-800-827-1000 if you are unsure about the authenticity of any message received.
- Use two-factor identification, like login.gov, when available.

DON'TS

- Do not sign a contract agreeing to pay an unauthorized company a percentage of your benefit payment in exchange for their assistance with your VA claim. If you need help filing a claim, there are representatives of VSOs, agents, and attorneys who have been accredited by VA to assist you.
- Do not sign a blank form for someone else to complete later.
 Always review the completed form before signing and keep a copy for yourself.
- Do not be fooled by companies who advertise they have special relationships with medical professionals and can guarantee your benefits award. If they are defrauding the Federal government, you could be held responsible for paying those benefits back.
- Do not provide identifying information like your social security number, medical records, or other personally identifiable information to anyone offering claims assistance before confirming their credentials using the Office of General Counsel Accreditation tool.



Tax Exemption Eligibility Changing

Governor Shapiro signed Act 27 of 2024 (formerly SB 126) into law June 17, 2024. This new law (51 Pa.C.S. Ch. 99), is a significant step towards supporting our veterans. It requires all Commonwealth departments and agencies to exclude federal and state veterans' benefits from the income assessment in need-based state programs, providing much-needed relief to our veterans.

The new law will take effect on August 16, 2024, meaning DMVA must continue to assess veterans' benefits as income until that date.

Are you Eligible?:

- 1. Wartime service (approx. 1975–1990) must have campaign medal or expeditionary medal on dd214
- 2. 100% totally and permanently disabled Or Individual Unemployability
- 3. Only the veteran's income is counted
- 4. Income limit, \$108,046.00
- 5. Must be a Lycoming County property

Cover; reduce heat; simmer 3 to 5 minutes or until thickened, stirring frequently to prevent sticking. CCP: Temperature must reach 165 F. or higher for 15 seconds.
- 7 Pour 1 qt sauce evenly over chicken in each pan. CCP: Hold for service at 140 F. or higher.

VA provides health care for Veterans from providers in your local community outside of VA. Veterans may be eligible to receive care from a community provider when VA cannot provide the care needed.

This care is provided on behalf of and paid for by VA.

Community care is available to Veterans based on certain conditions and eligibility requirements, and in consideration of a Veteran's specific needs and circumstances.

Community care must be first authorized by VA before a Veteran can receive care from a community provider.
