Official Notice of Election for Military and Overseas Voters Lycoming County November 5, 2024 General Election

This is an official notice of an election to be conducted on November 5, 2024 in Lycoming County. Military and overseas electors may register to vote and request an official absentee ballot by using the Federal Postcard Application (FPCA), available at www.votespa.com, www.fvap.gov, or the Voter Services website at www.lyco.org/vote. You may apply for an absentee ballot by submitting your FPCA by fax to (570) 320-2117 or by email to votespa.com, www.lyco.org/vote. You may apply for an absentee ballot by submitting your FPCA by fax to (570) 320-2117 or by email to votespa.com, www.lyco.org/vote.

Military and overseas electors may request an absentee ballot at any time prior to a primary or election. However, if time does not permit you to receive and return an official absentee ballot, you are also entitled to vote using the *Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot* (FWAB), available at www.fvap.gov, or the Voter Services website at www.lyco.org/vote. Military electors may use the FWAB to register to vote and vote simultaneously.

The FWAB can be used to vote for ALL federal, state, and local offices and ballot initiatives.

To vote using the FWAB, fill out and send in the Voter Information and the Official Backup Ballot.

To vote for offices or ballot initiatives, write the names of candidates or ballot initiatives in the appropriate section of the FWAB. Under the **Federal Offices** heading, enter the candidate name or political party you choose. Under the **Other Offices** heading, enter the state or local office, and then the candidate name or political party you choose. Under the **Ballot Initiative** heading, enter the title of the ballot initiative (referendum) you are voting on and then write YES or NO.

Local Ballot Questions

Old Lycoming Township Ballot Question

Should two additional supervisors be elected to serve in this township?

Plain English Statement

The purpose of the ballot question is to determine whether the electors of Old Lycoming Township favor increasing the size of the township's Board of Supervisors to five members from the current number of three members. Old Lycoming Township would then have five Supervisors instead of three Supervisors.

If the question is approved as a result of the number of "Yes" votes being greater than the number of "No" votes, then one additional Supervisor would be elected to a six-year term and one additional Supervisor would be elected to a four-year term on the 2025 municipal ballot in order to effect the increase, in addition to the normal number of Supervisors to be elected in a municipal election year. Thereafter, Supervisors would be elected corresponding to the number of Supervisors whose terms are scheduled to expire on the first Monday of the following January.

If the question is not approved as a result of the number of "No" votes being greater than or equal to the number of "Yes" votes, then the number of Supervisors would remain at three.
